Do I need a ticket?

This year's festival is a little different and most of the activity is taking place online. However, Shorts on the High Road is a collection of short films being screened live in Leytonstone Library Hall. To attend these sessions, it is best to book through Eventbrite so that we can monitor audience numbers and have attendees' contact details to support NHS track and trace. If there are seats available in a session these will be open for drop in audience members.

For digital events such as the Watch Parties and We Are Parable's Film Studio you should also book through the relevant booking link. These events have different access details which will be sent through once you have registered. All events and workshops are free.

Is the festival suitable for children and families?

There are many online activities for children and families. Have a look at the Barbican Family Film Club events and activities and the Storytelling Play Pack. Some of the Shorts on the High Road programme have been classified as 12 or above. Please check the film certification before booking your session for the shorts programme.
